

Temporary Community, Lasting Impact

Camp represents less than two percent of the year for the typical one-week camper. It doesn't last forever.

Campers leave at the end of their session. Staff leave at the end of the summer. We close the windows, lock the doors, turn off the water, and then we wait a whole year to do it again! Is it all worth it? So much work for such a short amount of time! What could we expect to accomplish in a girl's life in such a brief period?

During pre-camp training, we talk about "Temporary Community and the Power of Camp." Camp isn't supposed to last *forever*. It's supposed to end. And, if done well, that temporary experience produces lasting results.

Sometimes all we have is one week in a young girl's life - how much impact can Camp Cedarbrook have? Here is one parent's response:

Each time she goes she grows in confidence and in the Lord and in awareness of herself. It's so good for her and she loves it so much. The forced disconnect from the feast of life is the best thing for her. It's like a reset button. It's one of the best choices we made for her as parents and she just wants to keep going back and longer each summer!

Whether it is one week a year or one week in a girl's life, God uses that time and the camp experience, to transform lives! At camp, girls are reoriented toward slowing down, loving others, and seeking God. While the community is temporary, the connections and growth can last a lifetime.

Camp is it! We are one of the last places where girls can be for a week or more without their parents, their schools, and their phones, and be in a safe, supportive environment that encourages them to grow and follow Jesus.

At Camp Cedarbrook, we seek to provide a high-quality summer camp experience that inspires girls to live Christ-centered lives. We have been providing this experience with a lower mix of donated funds than other camps in our area; yet despite this, we have excellent camper numbers, an impressive program, and devoted staff. In order to maintain affordability and sustainability, it is imperative that we increase the proportion of our budget that comes from donations. Growing our donor base will help us keep costs down, maintain quality staff, and invest in our program and facilities.

We rely on the power of the Holy Spirit to transform the lives of everyone that comes to camp, and we do our best as co-laborers in this effort. I know that as part of the Camp Cedarbrook community, you understand the value and power of camp in shaping the lives of girls. 
2022 - A Year in Review






Operating Expenses and Income 2019-22
